

09:00- 09:15 Introduction by Dr. Ramon Dwarkasing, Chairman of the Forum of Economic and Fiscal Policy

09:15-10:45 First session - A Global overview: Economic Global Developments and Tax Policy

The first session will deal with the important role of tax policy to contribute to more economic productivity. The global economy remains fragile at this time. While the recovery in advanced economies is softening, many emerging market and developing economies have experienced a significant economic slowdown, and some large countries show signs of distress. The challenging environment calls for a comprehensive tax policy response to boost economic growth and reduce vulnerabilities. In particular, it is critical to identify tax policies that could lift productivity growth by promoting innovation, entrepreneurship and technology transfer. This requires an interaction between governments, business and society in designing tax policy.

During this session, Deputy Division Chief of Tax Policy Division of the International Monetary Fund IMF, dr.Ruud de Mooij, former Minister of State of India and chairman ITRAF, dr. Parthasarati Shome and former Director-General Taxation of the European Commission, Heinz Zourek will discuss these important developments from a global perspective. This session will be chaired by dr. Ramon Dwarkasing, chairman of the Forum on Economic and Fiscal Policy.

11:00 - 12:30 Second session - Tax Policy Conflicts between Countries

The second session of this Conference will deal with the controversy and conflicts of interest between different countries/continents in the area of tax policy. The role in tax policy of G20/OECD countries, developing economies and small island development states will be discussed. Countries design tax policies to realise economic growth. However, this might lead to spillovers in international taxation and to conflicts with policies of other countries. How does this correspond with the need to contribute to more economic productivity?

During this session Prof. Dr. Marcos Valadao (Brazil), Chief of International Tax Cooperation at the United Nations, Michael Lennard, Prof. Dr. Sol Picciotto (UK), Deputy Division Chief of Tax Policy Division of the IMF, dr. Ruud de Mooij, ms. Farah Karimi (Director Oxfam, Netherlands) and Deputy Solicitor General in Mauritius Rajesh Ramloll will discuss these important different interests in the tax policy area. This session will be chaired by ms Belema Obuoforibo, Director of the IBFD Knowledge Center and Member of the IBFD's executive board.

13:30 -15:10 Third session - The Impact of Tax Policy on Business and Society

The third session of this Conference will deal with the impact of tax policy on Business and Society. The publication of the Panama Papers called for tax policy actions. However, the OECD has already introduced the Global Forum on Transparency and Exchange of Information for Tax Purposes to establish standards for exchange of tax information among 133 countries and to create a level playing field. During this session, Head of the OECD Global Forum Secretariat, ms. Monica Bhatia will discuss this important global project on the exchange of information and tax transparency. Prof. dr. Mick Moore, CEO of the ICTD, mr. Bawono Kristiaji (Danny Darussalam Tax Center, Indonesia), dr. Ednaldo Silva (RoyaltyStat United States) and mr. Hans Bakker (AGTP) will discuss the developments in the tax area, including the OECD BEPS project, and the impact of tax policy on business and society. This session will be chaired by mr. D.P. Naban, senior partner of Lee, Hishammuddin, Allen and Gledhill in Malaysia.

15:30 - 17:00 Fourth session - Future Developments (Beyond) Tax Policy
